EC STATEMENT OF PRINCIPLES

[CODE-OF-CONDUCT-AND-ETHICS.pdf](#)

Statement of Principles – Horse Welfare EC requires adherence to humane treatment of horses in all activities under its jurisdiction.

All participants shall be bound by the Horse Welfare Code of Conduct.

EC is committed to:

- upholding the welfare of the horse, regardless of monetary value, as a primary consideration in all activities;
- requiring that horses be treated with kindness, respect, and the compassion that they deserve, and that they never be subjected to mistreatment;
- ensuring that owners, trainers, and exhibitors and their agents exercise appropriate care and responsibility in the handling, treatment, and transportation of their horses, as well as horses placed in their care for any purpose;
- providing for the continuous wellbeing of the horse by encouraging routine inspection and consultation with health care professionals and competition officials to achieve the highest possible standards of nutrition, health, comfort, and safety;
- continuing to support scientific studies on equine health and welfare;
- requiring owners, trainers, and exhibitors to know and follow their sanctioning organization's rules, and to work within industry regulations in all equestrian competitions; and,
- reviewing, revising, and developing competition rules and regulations that protect the welfare of the horse.

In determining whether conduct or treatment is cruel, abusive or inhumane, the standard to be applied will be the conduct or treatment expected of a reasonable person who is informed and experienced in equine training and exhibition procedures.

BRONZE DIVISION

- Bronze Division Class Fees are \$50 per class.
- Bronze Division classes are restricted to Junior and Adult Amateur Riders at the Training Level and First Level Dressage and for Para-Riders Walk/Walk-Trot/Walk-Trot-Canter Level 1-3.
- Western Dressage and Into Level classes are Open divisions and not restricted.
- Western Dressage is non-EC rated. Current WDAA rules and Tests will be used.

General Rules: All general rules of the Gold Division apply to the Bronze Division except for the following:

1. EC Horse Recording ID numbers are not required for Bronze Division horses.
2. EC Bronze Sport Licenses must be purchased online and included with entries by the closing date for verification.

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Rules & Regulations

The Kamloops Dressage for a Cause competition is sanctioned as a Gold and Bronze competition (#260156) of Equestrian Canada c/o House of Sport 2451 Riverside Drive Ottawa, ON Canada K1H 7X7 and governed by the Rules and Regulations of EC.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of Equestrian Canada, the National Equestrian Federation for Canada, and judged in accordance with the current EC Dressage Rule Book, Section E. Knowledge of the EC rules is the responsibility of the competitor.

Please direct any questions regarding rules to the show steward on the grounds at the competition. Every entry at an EC-sanctioned competition shall constitute an agreement by the person responsible, that includes the horse owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and the horse, shall be subject to the Equestrian Canada (EC) rules and regulations, and any additional rules specified by the competition herein the Official Prize List. It is the responsibility of all individuals participating in any capacity in EC-sanctioned competitions to be knowledgeable regarding the EC constitution and Dressage Rules for this competition.

Do not participate in this EC sanctioned competition in any capacity if you do not consent to be bound by the constitution and rules of EC and any additional rules imposed by the Competition.

Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current rules of EC and will be held and judged in accordance with the EC Rule Book. (A602.2)

All horses entered in any class at a competition must have met the requirements of Article A519, Vaccinations. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article A519, Vaccinations. (A602.8)

GENERAL RULES

Rulebooks - Equestrian Canada

****No Stallions permitted overnight due to stabling limitations. Haul in only.****

- **When registering for EC sanctioned competitions**, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are selfcoached. Coaches that are not present at the event with the athlete are not to be listed on the entry form. Coaches from other countries must be in good standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance. See Rules of Equestrian Canada, Section A, General Regulations, Article 102, Safe Sport Environments.
- **Neither Kamloops Therapeutic Riding Association, Circle Creek Equestrian, nor any member of the organizing committee** will be held responsible in any way for damage, injury or loss to persons, horses or property of spectators, owners, trainers, riders, or grooms. Kamloops Dressage for a Cause organizing committee reserves the right to limit the number of entries, refuse any entry for any reason, to split, cancel, combine, and or adjust any class in accordance with the rules stated herein, the competition Prize List. The organizing committee reserves the right to govern all conditions of the classes offered at the competition, and to make decisions on matters not specified in Equestrian Canada rule books, in consultation with the Official Steward.
- **Any horse at the competition** may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- **All Gold and Bronze Division competitors** are required to hold a minimum of a current Equestrian Canada Gold, Silver, or Bronze Sport licenses (or proof of purchase), and current Horse Council BC membership. These can be purchased online at www.hcbc.ca and www.equestrian.ca.
- **EC Horse Identification** is required for all horses in the Gold Division. Permanent Horse ID registration can be completed online with Equestrian Canada through your sport license "My EC" when logged in at www.equestrian.ca. Owners may contact Equestrian Canada for assistance to purchase a new Horse ID number or transfer an existing horse passport number to a new Horse ID number. Bronze Division horses

are not required to have an EC Horse Identification number to compete in Bronze Divisions.

- **Amateur Status** must be listed on your EC Sport License card to compete in the Adult Amateur classes. All entries are required to pay the Dressage Levy fee of \$10 which is paid by the competition to Equestrian Canada For National Dressage Programs.
- **Equine Medications Control Drug** testing fee of \$8 for Gold entries or \$4.00 for Bronze entries per horse is mandatory for EC competitions and is included in the online entry process.
- **All horses entered in any class** at a competition must meet the requirements of vaccinations. See Equestrian Canada rulebook.
- **Equestrian Canada Vaccination Rule:** All horses attending Equestrian Canada sanctioned competitions must have been administered Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within six months (+21 day grace period) before arrival at the event. No horse shall receive vaccination within seven days prior to arrival at the event. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be asked to leave the event site at the discretion of the competition management. Since 2021, all horses are required to have proof of vaccinations submitted to the Competition Office prior to receiving its show number. Please attach a proof of vaccination with your entry.
- **All riders and competitors** are required to wear proper fitting, approved headgear protection, with the safety harness correctly secured, always while mounted on the competition grounds. Approved headgear that meets the ASTM safety standard and displays the SEI seal or the British Safety Standard (BSI) seal of approval.
- All entries will be with the online Entry Form or manual Entry form (which will have to be scanned and emailed). If needed an entry form can be printed, filled out and then emailed to dressageforacause@ktra.ca. Entry Closing date of Monday, June 15, 2026. After the closing date, entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organizing committee with a late fee of \$25. You will still need to submit signatures manually if you complete the online form.

- **Payment of show fees is due upon registration** for the horse show. Unless you are paying via credit card.
- **Late entries** may be accepted at the discretion of the organizing committee and pay a late fee of \$25 per one Entry Form for each horse/rider combination. Parents or guardians of youth exhibitors must sign all forms as the person responsible for the youth competitor. Show management reserves the right to refuse any entry for any reason.
- It is the **competitor's responsibility** to submit entries correctly prior to the closing date period. Entry confirmations are emailed for all entries accepted prior to the closing date.
- **Ride Times** will be posted on Fox Village and emailed to competitors prior to the competition. Please check day sheets posted at the show office daily for any updates.
- Please check **ride times** to ensure your entry is correct on the Rider Times schedule as submitted for the competition. Contact Jutta Jealous at dressageforacause@ktra.ca if any errors are noted when Ride Time schedules are received.
- **Horse substitutions** may be accepted where the horse substituted is entered in the same classes as the original entry. Substitution at a different level from the original entry may not be possible to accommodate, however, **MAY** be accepted at the discretion of the Organizing Committee. Substitutions may be accepted until noon on Thursday and must be received by the show committee.
- **Hors Concours (HC)** entries may be accepted for riders/horses wishing to ride for experience or feedback. HC entries will receive a score sheet and judge's comments but are not eligible for placings or awards.
- **Show Schedule** will try to accommodate each horse rider combination as best as possible to allow for suitable warm-up time for all tests entered. A minimum of 40 minutes between start of ride times will be scheduled (this is for a rider on multiple horses).
- **Classes may be scheduled at any time or in any order on the day** listed in the class schedule. Ride times may be changed in the case of any error, overlapping times, or to facilitate the running of the show. Current day sheets will be posted on the scoreboard.

- **Splitting or Combining of Rider Categories Junior, Adult Amateur, or Open:** Classes may be divided into Junior, Adult Amateur, and/or Open categories after the closing date where three or more entries per category exist within the class. Where there are fewer than three entries per category, the class may be placed as one Open class at the discretion of the Organizing Committee.
- **The maximum number of dressage tests per horse per day** is four tests from Introductory to First Level, and three tests per day for Second Level through FEI Level per horse/rider combination. Any horse/rider combination may compete in two consecutive dressage levels at the same competition.
- **Test Callers** are permitted in classes other than FEI. Callers must be provided by the competitor. All FEI tests must be performed by memory with no test callers; penalty is elimination from the class.
- **Whips** may be to a maximum length of 1.2 meters, 1.0 meters per ponies and are permitted in all classes.
- **Legboots & bandages:** Allowed in warm-up area only - forbidden in competition.
- **Tack Checks** are the responsibility of the exhibitor to present themselves to the Steward for tack check immediately following their test ride. Failure to do so may incur elimination. Competitors on deck should remain in the warm-up ring under the supervision of stewards until their ride time. Competitors arriving late for their ride time may be eliminated at the discretion of the Judge.
- **Ribbons:** Ribbons will be awarded to 3rd place in all classes. Ribbons will be provided with dressage tests. No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3rd position. When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following chart of percentages:
 - 1st 63% or higher
 - 2nd 60% to 62.9%
 - 3rd 58% to 59.9%
- **Competition & Warm-up Rings** will be designated. Gold/Bronze competition rings will be available for schooling from 1pm-7pm on Friday. The warm up ring will remain open for the duration of the competition. The competition rings will be closed for schooling after the start of the competition. If you are using a headset in the warmup ring please only use one earbud only.

- **Lunging** is permitted in designated areas only. No lunging at any time in the indoor or outdoor rings.
- **Stabling and Tack Stalls** will be in Temporary Stabling for all Bronze and Gold Division horses stabled on grounds for a cost of \$40 plus GST per night for the competition including shavings for all stalls. We highly encourage locals to haul in (no fee) as we will have limited stabling. There will be no tack stalls available. Stalls may be occupied after 12 noon on Friday prior to the start of the competition. Please do not arrive before noon on Friday unless prior approval of the competition manager is confirmed in advance. Early arrivals are permitted with an additional stabling cost (\$40 plus GST) per day payable on entry forms. Warm-up arena will be designated for competitors arriving prior to Friday warm-up day. A stall clean out fee of \$50 is applied to all entries. If stalls are not cleaned out prior to departure, a refund will not be issued. Horses may haul in using the designated parking.
- **Trailer Parking** is permitted in designated trailer parking areas only. All trailers must be parked in the trailer parking area. Please do not leave trucks and trailers parked unattended and unauthorized areas on show grounds at any time. Horses are not allowed to be left tied to your trailer unattended. No panelling off trailers.
- **Dry Camping** - \$20/night. No hookups.
- **Dogs** - No dogs allowed outside of the camping/trailer parking area. Must be on leash and pick up after your dog.
- **Competition numbers are not provided** and will be the responsibility of the participant. Must be worn at all times on either the bridle, rider, or halter. No exceptions.
- **Protest:** A protest at an EC sanctioned competition other than those specific matters covered in division rules must comply with the following provisions: a) a protest is eligible only if made by an officiating judge, and owner, lessee, trainer, coach, competitor or authorized agent, in the division in which the question arises; b) a protest must be made in writing and addressed to the Show Secretary; c) must be signed; and d) must be accompanied by a deposit of \$100 in cash.
- **Vet Note/Scratch** Entries cancelled before the closing date, with or without veterinary or medical certificates will have all fees less the administration fee refunded. Cancellations after the closing date and before the start of competition that are received by the show secretary in writing and with a veterinarian or medical certificate may be refunded 50% of class fees, and stall fees if not assigned at the time of cancellation. Administration fees are non-refundable. Cancellations after the start of competition will receive no refunds.

CHAMPIONSHIP RULES

Champions will be awarded for each level listed below. Awards may be picked up from the Show Office on Sunday afternoon. A minimum of three riders in a division is required for prizes to be awarded. Division categories at this show are Junior, Adult Amateur, and Open. Divisions and levels may be combined in accordance with EC Rules and at the discretion of the Show Committee in the case of low entries. Any test receiving a score below 50% on a technical test is not eligible for class awards or Championships. Championship categories will be split and awarded where there are three or more entries per category; if fewer than three entries exist in a rider category, scores may be placed in a single Open category for the level.

GOLD Introductory through Fourth Level Championships: Competitors must enter a minimum of three tests at the level during the competition to be eligible for Championship awards. Championship scores are calculated by combining the results from both Championship (C) classes (Saturday Test 2 and Sunday Test 3).

GOLD FEI Championships: Championship scores are calculated by combining the results from both Championship (C) classes.

BRONZE Introductory through Fourth Level Championships: Competitors must enter a minimum of three tests at the level during the competition to be eligible for Championship awards. Championship scores are calculated by combining the results from both Championship (C) classes at each level.

Championships will be awarded once they are confirmed and posted on the scoreboard and Sunday after the last rider in the class is finished.

Championship Awards: Results for each class will be posted after the class has been pinned. Competitors who leave the show grounds before their class results and Championship awards are posted will forfeit those awards. Out-of-town competitors who need to leave early may make prior arrangements to have their awards collected or shipped. Shipping costs, if required, will be the responsibility of the competitor.

Any decisions regarding Championship results not specified here in the Prize List, which may result in a decision or ruling, will be at the sole discretion of the Show Manager and Dressage Committee.

Kamloops Dressage for a Cause – Biosecurity Policy

Purpose:

To protect the health and welfare of all horses, riders, handlers, volunteers, and spectators by minimizing the risk of contagious disease transmission at the Kamloops Dressage for a Cause show.

Risk Identification

Horse shows bring together animals from multiple barns, regions, and vaccination histories. Travel, stall confinement, and new environments can increase susceptibility to disease. The greatest risk arises through direct contact between horses, shared equipment, and contaminated surfaces.

Prevention Measures

Vaccinations & Health Documentation

- All horses attending the competition must have documented proof of up-to-date vaccinations (including equine influenza and herpes virus) consistent with current sport regulations.
- Horses that do not meet vaccination requirements may be refused entry or asked to leave the show grounds.
- If a horse cannot be vaccinated for medical reasons, a veterinary letter explaining the exemption must be submitted with entries.

Stall & Facility Hygiene

- Stalls must be cleaned prior to use; soiled bedding should be removed and disposed of in designated areas.
- Manure and waste materials will be kept in confined disposal zones away from high-traffic areas.
- Show management will provide cleaning supplies and disinfectants for shared equipment areas.

Movement Control

- Limit unnecessary movement between barns and competition areas.
- Avoid shared equipment (water buckets, tack, grooming tools) where possible.
- Riders and handlers should sanitize hands and reuse gloves if they have contact with multiple horses.

Response & Mitigation (If a Horse Shows Signs of Illness)

If a horse appears sick or shows symptoms suggestive of contagious disease, the following steps will be taken immediately:

- 1) Notify the horse's owner, rider, event manager, groundskeeper, and an on-call veterinarian must be informed immediately.
- 2) The sick horse will be moved to a designated isolation area away from other horses and people. Anyone handling the isolated horse must use proper barrier precautions and disinfect equipment afterward.
- 3) A veterinarian will examine the horse to determine the cause of illness and assess whether it is contagious.
- 4) Once a diagnosis is made, show management will notify competitors and relevant parties, balancing transparency with minimizing unnecessary concern. Horses that had direct contact (shared feed, grooming tools, adjacent stalls) will be considered higher risk and may be monitored or restricted as advised by the veterinarian.
- 5) Exposed horses may be restricted from traveling off-site until the veterinarian deems it safe. Owners of exposed horses should monitor their animals for symptoms and follow guidance from show officials or veterinarians.
- 6) Once cleared by a veterinarian, horses may return home with guidance on ongoing monitoring and signs to watch for.

A brief report summarizing the event and response will be shared with competitors to support awareness and continual improvement of biosecurity practices.

Cooperation Required

Participation in Kamloops Dressage for a Cause signifies agreement to follow these biosecurity policies. Compliance protects all participants and supports a safe competitive environment. Non-compliance may result in removal from the event without refund.

EC SPORT LICENSING 2026

SAFETY, INCLUSIVITY, & EXCELLENCE

Your guide to the latest updates for the competition season in Canada

IMPORTANT CHANGES have been implemented to enhance the safety and inclusivity of equestrian sport. Whether you're an athlete, parent, coach, official, or competition staff, your role is crucial in upholding these standards. Here's what you need to know:

SAFE SPORT TRAINING PREREQUISITE:

- The two free EC Safe Sport training modules must be completed before purchasing a Sport Licence. Check your training status on MyEC by clicking on the ECampus button.

DISCONTINUED TEMPORARY LICENCES AND TEMPORARY HORSE REGISTRATIONS:

- Temporary EC Sport Licences are now discontinued at competitions. All riders, owners, and coaches must possess an EC Sport Licence to participate in events. All horses must have a Horse Recording where level and division require.

AVAILABLE SHOW LEVEL UPGRADES:

- Explore higher-level competitions with temporary upgrades via your MyEC Portal. Note: National Rankings Points are not tabulated for upgraded results.

COACH STATUS REMINDER—2026 SEASON

- Coaches attending EC-Sanctioned competition must hold a valid Licensed Coach Status. Any Coach with Registered Coach Status must purchase a Single Event Upgrade for \$55.00. This purchase can be made through the MyEC account.
- Coaches without a valid Licensed Coach Status or Registered Coach Status with Single Event Upgrade Status are not eligible to be represented as a coach at EC-Sanctioned events and may be subject to fines. Please complete your requirements in advance to avoid any fines and delays.

DECLARE YOURSELF A SELF-COACHED ATHLETE

- Athletes without a coach on-site can declare themselves as self-coached by entering their own **EC SPORT LICENSE NUMBER** or enter "self-coached" in the **COACH FIELD** on their registration/entry form.
- Please note: Coaches that **DO NOT ATTEND** the events **SHOULD NOT BE LISTED** on the entry form.

“ When registering for EC sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are self-coached. Coaches from other countries, must be in good-standing with their home federation and must declare/have proof of insurance.
